Quarter 2, 2021 - Main Highlights

- Over the second quarter as a whole, the FTSE World Government ex-US Bond Index rose 0.5% in US dollar unhedged terms. In local currency terms the index remained broadly flat, with benchmark international currencies rising 0.5% on average against the US dollar. The strongest performing markets were Mexico (+3.5%), Poland (+2.9%) and Canada (+2.5%). Currency was the main driver of outperformance in the case of Mexico and Poland, whereas for Canada it was more balanced between currency strength and local bond market outperformance. The weakest performing markets were Norway (-0.3%), Japan (-0.1%) and the Eurozone (+0.2%). Currency was the chief detractor in the case of Norway and Japan, whereas for the Eurozone it was local bond market underperformance.
- The Fund marginally outperformed the benchmark index over the second quarter. Positioning to the Japanese and Mexican bond markets added to performance over the quarter. The underweight to Eurozone bond markets also added to performance over the quarter. These positions were partially offset by the underweights to the Canadian dollar and euro, which both modestly detracted from relative performance over the quarter.
